From Your Chapter Educator

Greeting Road Runners,

Chapter M (Mansfield) welcomes Chris Shoenthal as their new Rider Educator. Chris is replacing David and Ginny Topley, and we appreciate all they have done for the Moonlighters and Chapter M. This month's resource contains several good articles to spur your ideas. It is the safety article section from Cycle Connections online magazine. http://76.12.53.172/articledetail.asp?TypeID=24&PageId=49 . Good food for thought.

Have you registered for the Texas District Rally yet? We will need "all hands on deck" to make this a success and FUN for all participants. There will be a Level 4 luncheon on the Saturday at the Rally. I encourage you to register early for the rally, as a head count has to be turned in for the lunch by May 9.

This month I decided to do a review of brakes and braking. As all of you know we depend on traction to keep us balanced on a motorcycle. This is accomplished by being on the throttle or on the brakes, and of course if we are not moving we use our feet to balance. We also know total stopping distance consists of three parts; Perception, distance, reaction distance, and braking distance. When we brake we apply appropriate pressure to both brakes to get us to slow or to stop. How we apply the correct pressure depends on our type of brakes and what skills we process. One point that is under discussion to put it politely is do we use 2 or 4 fingers on the front brake. Old school says four fingers that was when you had drum front brakes. Now with single disk or dual disk with ABS they say you can use 1 or 2 fingers to brake as you don't need the same pressure to get the same result with 4. This is true for the most part for normal braking. You use what you practice or develop thru what I like to call muscle memory. In other words, it's an action that you do subconsciously without thinking about it. What do you do in an Emergency situation? What I have experienced with many thousands of students that if you panic as in realizing you have to stop now you reach and grab the front brake with all four fingers. If you are used to only using 1 or 2 fingers guess what happens? That's correct you over pressurize the front brake and usually lock it up resulting is you going on an unplanned trip. (Yes you can skid anti-lock or ABS brakes).

What you have to do in order not to crash is practice emergency stops. One of the things I learned in the military is you practice something enough that is how you will react when you panic or are in an emergency situation without thinking about it. The best way to accomplish this is to set up a brake chute and practice quick stops. Start out with your speed low till you get used to going faster and applying brakes more aggressively. The chute should consist of a start point, a braking point and enough space to brake without running into anything. Do not look directly at the breaking point but keep your head and eyes looking forward then when you lose whatever you put down for a braking point out of your peripheral vision come to a stop as quickly and safely as you can. Another way is to have someone at the end of the chute giving you stops signal at different times simulating something pulling out in front of you. Make sure you are both coordinated with each other on what to do. If you have any thoughts on this, I would be glad to hear them. Have a great month and ride safe.
