

From The Chapter Educator, Harry Whipple:



Greetings Road Runners. First news from DPS on Licenses. You are no longer required to take a written test from the DMV to get your endorsement on you license. All that is required if you are over 18 is to take and pass the Motorcycle Safety Course. (Notice I didn't call it the Basic rider's course.) The Motorcycle Safety Course is the beginner's course, still takes 2 days on provided bikes and it is going thru changes. If you have been riding awhile and do not have a license with an endorsement, and do not want to take the Motorcycle Safety Course there is a 1 day intermediate class you can take on your bike. If you successfully pass you take the MSB 8 card to the DMV and get your endorsement.

The MSB 8 cards are going thru changes. The will only reflect the actual course you are taking at the time instead of just checking a box. Example if you take the Motorcycle Safety Course 2 (BRC 2) you card will only list the MSC2.


More changes in the works and I will report on them as I get them.

Everyone knows there is a link between salt and high blood pressure. What you may have not known is in the 1920's the government mandated that iodine be added to table salt due to a growing number of iodine-deficiency diseases, especially goiters. Iodine is critical to the function of the Thyroid gland, and goiters typically result from too little iodine or an imbalance of the two thyroid hormones, thyroxine (T4) and triodothyronine (T3). Moral of the story if you use salt substitutes make sure you are getting your daily dose of iodine (150mcg per day).

Last but not least do not forget we are still in winter even though it has gotten up to 80 on a few days. Remember to dress in layers so you can add and subtract as required.

I Mea Culpa I'd like to set the record straight. In last month's article, I talked about Chapter officer positions only taking a few minutes per month in addition to the Chapter gathering. I heard from a few folks who thought I was minimizing the importance of those positions. Believe me, that was not my intent. If Chapters are thought of as the body of our Association, Chapter Officers are the brain. Without the brain directing the various bodily functions, the body will die. Without Officers to provide direction for various Chapter activities, the Chapter must close. The point I was attempting to make is that being a Chapter Officer is

not a difficult, time consuming, job with a lot of requirements. Yes, there are some responsibilities associated with being an Officer. While they are important and must be done, they do not take a lot of time to accomplish – in many cases, only a few minutes when done on a monthly basis. How long does it take the Treasurer to make the 50/50 deposit and balance the check book each month? How long does it take the MEC to make their contacts and welcome new Members to the Chapter, then drop one email to the District MEC with the results? There are nearly two years worth of Rider Education newsletter articles already written for the Educator to include in the newsletter. How long does it take for the Educator to fill out the N.6 Chapter activity report and email it to District? Becoming an officer may not be for everyone, but too often it is viewed as something to be avoided at all costs. Every one of us has made some type of negative comment regarding Officer positions. Instead of offering thanks and congratulations for accepting the position, its condolences, sucker, or I'm sorry you had to do this. Did you get the engineer's hat when you were railroaded into this? I've been (insert position) and I ain't doing it again. What about comments regarding how much time the position takes? I don't know how Bill was able to do this since he still has a job. If you were a Member, especially a newer Member, overhearing any of the above, how interested would you be in taking on an Officer role? Sometimes we can be our own worst enemies. The reality is that Officers are supposed to have FUN too. That's not to say its always roses and candy – there can be difficult situations that must be dealt with once in a while. But those are the exception, not the rule. Taking an active role in your Chapter should be a very rewarding experience. After all, being an Officer really boils down to doing two things: 1) provide opportunities for the Members to do what they enjoy most and 2) ensuring the Chapter continues to exist into the future. While each of those can contain a lot of elements, if you are accomplishing each of those two major goals, you are fully benefiting not only your Chapter, but GWRRA as a whole. 
Why do we have a railroad theme for a motorcycle rally? Well, if it weren't for railroads most of east Texas would not have grown the way it did. Before there was oil there was timber. Early in the history of Texas logging crews drug logs to the rivers to be moved by boats south to Houston. Once the railroads started to grow loggers had a more reliable means of transporting their product to the mills and consumers. By 1879 over 2400 miles of railroad had been constructed in Texas and all but 100 miles was east of a line extending from Denison through Ft. Worth and continuing on to Austin.

Beginning with the first chartered railroad in 1836 railroads grew and spread throughout Texas until over 300 different railroad companies were chartered by the state. By 1992 this number had been reduced to less than 40 companies through mergers, acquisitions and deregulation. Today even fewer railroad companies remain but their legacy can still be seen in the old depots in small towns throughout east Texas.


