The most important reason for wearing the gear is if you miss compensating for a risk you have a little protection to reduce the severity of the consequences of the miss. Third always practice the skills you have acquired from training classes. The main reason I keep teaching Motorcycling classes is to keep on top of my game. Unlike a car if you do not ride and practice your skills you forget about them. Last but not least always match your speed to the conditions. If you are in a hurry to get someplace do not do it on a motorcycle. When you are driving faster you have to predict and react faster to whatever may happen. Odds and physics are against you and when you miss something you will have to pay.
