Another month gone by and activities have really picked up. Look thru this month's newsletter articles submitted for your viewing pleasure about all the events.

Largest topic for discussion since we have taken over as Chapter Directors is the number of gatherings that the Chapter has been holding. When Dan and Donna were running the Chapter they would hold 2

monthly gatherings. One in Greenville and one in Wyle. This worked for them and the agenda they had for the Chapter.

Chapter G2 was founded in Farmersville Texas, although the Chapter Home Base is Greenville Texas. GWRRA rules do not require to join any Chapter anywhere. You can choose to be with one home chapter or belong or attend two. It's your choice.

The following is from the Officers Handbook:

WHAT IS A CHAPTER GATHERING?

It is the means whereby GWRRA has FUN, grows, teaches, educates, informs and establishes a basis for GWRRA's very existence. The Chapter gathering is the most important aspect of what we strive the hardest to accomplish; educating our Members in ways of safety, skill, knowledge and the FUN OF GWRRA.

If we, as Officers, recognize and acknowledge these responsibilities to our Members, we understand the importance and the difficulty of obtaining our goals as represented in our motto, "FRIENDS FOR FUN, SAFETY AND KNOWLEDGE." In paraphrasing an adage, "You can take Members to water, but you can't make them drink," we understand, in a volunteer, hobby environment, the difficulty in even getting our Members TO the water, much less getting them to take a drink. We have found the only way to get them involved (so we can provide the "water") is to provide a positive, FUN and worthwhile environment. We call this a Chapter gathering.

Properly done, a Chapter gathering is the perfect medium to carry out our prime responsibility to our Members. It provides them a place to come to gain fun, friends, knowledge and camaraderie. It provides us the opportunity to "sugar coat" the pills of safety so we can teach our "family" the tools and skills that will enable them to live longer and to better enjoy their chosen hobby — Motorcycling.

Our immediate goal is to entice our Members to come to a monthly activity with their "family." We do this by making our Chapter gatherings FUN! We make it a relaxed, non-political, non-religious, friendly place where there are No Strangers... good food, interesting people and educational programs. This is not as difficult as it sounds, but it is very basic to accomplishing another of our missions: EDUCATE! If we can motivate our Members to attend a Chapter gathering, our job is half done. We must then insure that the gathering is so good, so interesting, so entertaining, so rewarding and so much FUN that they will return every month. They will also

"talk it up" with their friends, thereby helping GWRRA receive the positive publicity that goes a long way in attracting new Members into our "family."

Good FUN Chapter gatherings cannot be overemphasized. They are the backbone of a successful Chapter.

Ione and I are not able to provide two Chapter Gatherings every month. Our goal is to do everything we can in one gathering to accomplish the goals we are tasked with in the officer handbook. We also do not want to have people attending more gatherings than they want or need to.

Since there are people who choose to be in our Chapter, but have a hard time attending the gathering in Greenville we need to come up with a solution so they can get the needed information to participate in Chapter activities.

Our solution for the problem is this. Dan and Donna volunteered to attend the gathering in Greenville and hold a Separate gathering in Wyle to put out the needed information. No changes or scheduling will occur at the meeting only a passing of information that was put out at the Gathering in Greenville. No one will be required to attend the gathering in Wyle unless they want to. That is what we will do for the time being to see how it works. Lots of plans for events are shaping up for the next couple of month. We can always use fresh ideas with events you would like to see. You may submit your suggestions to me or Tom and Judy are ride coordinators to get them planned.

You may have heard that the old Parking Lot Practice program has gone away. It has actually been incorporated into a new program designed to increase individual and team riding skills. Shiny Side Up has 5 components: The individual components of the program are The Pursuit of Excellence, The League of Aces, The Vanguard Riders Course, Top Gun Trials, and The Amazing Team Challenge. 

The photo below is a replica of what may be the first motorcycle ever made: the Daimler Reitwagen, built in 1885. The replica is made of walnut wood. It was made by Ray and Roy Behner, Jim Carlton, and Fred Hoffman. They had no plans and had only a photograph of the original bike to go by. The men started [building] the replica in 1984 and finished it in time for a ride during the Reitwagen's centennial on Nov. 10, 1985. The replica is on display at the AMA



Motorcycle Museum in Pickerington, Ohio.







RIDER EDUCATION COURSES

The number and availability of courses is dependent upon the number of participants. You will be notified of your class time and location as soon as possible. **Note: Certification cost is per bike!***

ARC: Experience advanced techniques in turning, maximum braking, and swerving plus mental and situational strategies in GWRRA's own Advanced Rider Course. Co-Riders welcome. 8 hours (classroom and range)

ARC (Recertification): The GWRRA ARC for those who have PREVIOUSLY COMPLETED the ARC. Includes discussions at the beginning of the course and between exercises. 5 hours (range only)

SIDECAR: Experience advanced techniques of riding with a sidecar as well as situation strategies and accident avoidance tactics. 8 hours (3 classroom/5 range).

TRAILERING: Learn advanced trailering techniques and strategies for safe and enjoyable travel. Motorcycles only--no trikes or sidecars please. 8 hours (3 classroom/5 range)

TRIKE: This course teaches advanced riding skills for the trike rider such as maximum braking, swerving and turning. 8 hours (3 classroom/5 range)

TRIKE/TRAILER: This course combines the Trike Rider Course (TRC) with some guided practice in backing a trailer. 8 hours (3 classroom/5 range)

TRC-R (Recertification): The GWRRA TRC for those who have PREVIOUSLY COMPLETED the TRC. Includes discussions at the beginning of the course and between exercises. 5 1/2 hours (range only)

Vanguard Rider Course: A performance based course to be used in conjunction with a 2 1/2 hour seminar to be taken separately.

AORC (Add-On Kit Rider Course): A Rider Course designed for the motorcycle with a 2-Wheel Add-on Kit installed.

CPR/FIRST AID (New): This course is designed to teach and certify you in the basic principles of CPR and First Aid. 8 hours

CPR/FIRST AID (Renew): This course is designed to refresh and recertify you in the basic principles of CPR and First Aid. Current CPR/First Aid certification is required at the time of the class. 4 hours
