







Greetings Road Runners. We had a few for riding days in April then March but the Weather was still a factor. One weekend Saturday was a beautiful 70 degrees with lots of Sunshine and Sunday the Temperature didn't get above 50 and it rained hard most of the day. My point to the weather report is making sure you dress and prepare for conditions. That way you don't end up with heat exhaustion or hypothermia, like some of my students almost had during range exercises.

As most of you may know to get a MC endorsement you must take the BRC class in order to do so. Also there is about 60 % of the motorcyclists in the state of Texas riding without a License. Under the old MSF courses you could take an ERC course and if needed take the Licensing Tests and then go to the DMV and take a written Test get you license that way, without taking the BRC. Since the BRC was updated in 2013, that opportunity is no longer available. There is a BRC2 which has a Licensing Portion but the state has not adopted it. There is an alternative available for riders to take and that is the Total Control Intermediate Course. The state accepts this as an alternate way for experienced riders to get a license. I attended this course on the 20th of April in Irving Texas. This class was a true learning experience. You sign up for the class where it is offered by a sponsor. Cost is more than the BRC and is 8 hours long verses the 16 you take for the BRC. Here is the eye opener. You take a skills test on the range before you start the class. If you do not pass the skills test you do not get to take the course. The test is challenging. I cannot tell you the skill tests or the exercises in the class as the material is copyrighted, but I believe you will leave the class with improved skill levels.

I was questioned on why I instruct my students to use 4 fingers on the front brake instead of 2. For some time now modern motorcycles have front brakes that you can effectively operate with 2 fingers. Dirt bike riders often only use 1 finger when using the front brake. The reason I teach with 4 is when you train to use the brake you operate it as you are trained. If you learn with only two fingers that is what you will use to make most of you stops. For most stops and even some emergency stops that is fine. I learned that if you panic on a motorcycle you grab with all 4 fingers on the brake and the clutch. If you have learned with 2 fingers and you grab with 4 you chance locking the front wheel and causing a crash. Grabbing the clutch with 2 or 4 fingers has the same effect, your immediately remove power going from the engine to the rear wheel.

That is all for this month. May has started out with beautiful riding weather.

Riding in the Rain

The longer you ride your motorcycle the more likely you will be in a situation where riding in the rain is unavoidable. While most riders will avoid an afternoon lunch ride that has a high possibility of less than ideal riding weather, sometimes your destination is a long ways away and one must venture out to get there. This was the case for Donna and I on the weekend of April 18th to the GWRRA Region "H" Rally in Marshall TX.

The Rally was only 168 miles away, but we were unable to leave until Donna got home from work. The weather forecast called for rain and thunderstorms and the radar at weather.com showed scattered storm cells moving in a direction that might allow us to navigate around the bad ones. The ride started off well and the first two hours of this "Three hour tour" (S.S Minnow comes to mind) were uneventful with Rainbows and a natural fireworks display of lightning. We dodged the storm using the weather app "Raindar" on my cellphone (cellphone is attached via Ram Mount on my left Handlebar, GPS on the right).

Donna wanted to hit "Ryan's Buffet" In Longview for a late dinner and hopefully allow the huge storm cell to our east on Highway 80 to stay ahead of us. Well, for a while we stayed behind the storm, and then we started to catch the tail end with some drizzle, then light rain. Donna had her Frogg Toggs on (pants and jacket) while I only had the jacket part on, but have never had much of a problem staying dry as long as we kept moving. I asked her how she was doing, and as is typical of this tough chicky who is almost impossible to scare or show anything but delight while on the back of our Goldwing, she said she was doing great.

The light rain turned a little heavier but the radar showed the worst of it was staying ahead of us. The heaviness of the rain dictated the speed as we and the cars and trucks on highway 80 slowed down. I figured this would work in our favor as the bad stuff would keep moving east and further away from us. Well, I was wrong.

The rain was now coming down pretty good, the visor on the helmet had to rise to handle fogging as well as rain drops inside and outside. My glasses had to be slid down to the end of my nose to have a clear view of the



road over my windshield. In Gladewater I decided to find a gas station to pull over to let the storm get past us, but the roads were flooding and we drove through several washes from left to right were the rain waters were clearly pushing against my toes on the foot pegs, and at one point was hitting my ankles.

Each entrance to the gas stations had water hiding the curbs making that more dangerous than continuing to a better stopping point as well as several tree limbs down in the right lane. We were both laughing as I was soaked to the skin and Donna's feet were drenched. I finally found a Valero in

Gladewater where I could see the curb and could navigate safely in. Donna could not stop laughing at the image of me standing next to the bike, water running out my pant legs and forming a huge puddle beneath me, my helmet visor up just enough to see my glasses at the end of my nose, my beady eyes barely visible.

There was no point staying put as we were wet (but not cold thought) we just waited for the downpour to move east and we headed back out on the road. About 200 yards down the road we had our final deep water experience, as I downshifted to allow us to plow through to the other side of this "river". By the way, we spent most of our time in the left lane to avoid the majority of standing water that seemed to be submerging the right lane up to the dotted white line. A Semi truck heading the opposite way had the same idea of staying out of the right lane and hit that deep water at the same time sending a wall of water onto the bike with enough force that I worried could break the windscreen. It held and so did we. For the rest of the trip we had steady strong rain but few matching the excitement in Gladewater.

We got into Marshall about 9:45, a little more than an hour longer than it should have taken. In the rain we never figured out which exit we needed for Ryan's Buffet, and in retrospect, had we stopped for coffee and food way before we closed on that storm we would have likely arrived dry and with no story to tell. On the way home on Saturday, we used that Raindar App to dodge scattered storm cells and get in the house 10 minutes before the heavens once again opened up and down poured. All in all this was a neat experience with a ton of lessons learned that will help us in the future.

- 1. When I see the clear possibility of crossing the path of rain I will put on my rain gear (all of it!)
- 2. I will get a good set of over the boot rain covers and will wear them.
- Using the Raindar app works best when you do keep a greater space between you and storms, as they can expand or shift directions and be on top of you before you can stop and put on the gear.
- 4. Keep plenty of dry towels on the bike (in airtight bags when possible) for drying off visors and glasses.
- 5. Always pack an extra set of clothes to change into including shoes. It is no fun wearing wet clothes until they dry
- 6. Keep plastic kitchen bags on the bike to hold wet clothes
- 7. The Goldwing will handle rain, even significant water on the pavement, but watch the speed and think of how the other vehicles on the road will impact you when they enter the water too. Downshift to give you the power to counteract those forces.
- 8. In the dark you can see standing water on the road in the distance but is much more of a challenge as you get closer. Keep that in mind as you adjust you speed or plan your position on the road
- 9. Remember that standing water can hide obstacles including pot holes, debris and curbs. Avoid it when you can.


