which is riding and trying to help others getting into the Christmas spirit. We have been fortunate enough to attend two already this year. The first was in early October and we rode the 2016) kids event at the Texas motor Speedway. Then this last Sunday on the 30th we rode the 24th annual teddy bear ride which left IKEA up in Frisco, and headed down to the Harley-Davidson finance center in Plano. Both were very well attended and were a lot of fun.

It is also this time a year when folks start looking to decorate the bikes to make a more festive for the holidays. They certainly get more attention at the holiday rides with decorations and Tommy and Judy often have Santa Clauses and trees on their luggage racks. Tom even has a snowman riding a motorcycle. The kids love to push that button and see it ride. While all the riders I have seen in our chapter have been very careful to choose the decorations carefully for safety, Donna and I have seen many bikes out there with decorations that start to borderline on reckless or at least questionable. Make sure to secure all your decorations appropriately. Make sure that nothing is hanging off the bike in a way that might impact other riders or falloff and going to the tire of riders behind you. Also, the weight of some of the things you may be carrying on your bike this time year, should be balanced between the left and right hand side. A bike that is not balanced is more difficult to control. Just a few things to keep in mind to keep your riding safe.

Regarding chapter leadership in G2. As Donna and I have communicated in last month's newsletter as well as our two chapter meetings, we are stepping down as Chapter Directors at the end of this year. In a conversation with Harry Whipple, he expressed an interest and perhaps coming back and leading the chapter. Donna and I have offered to continue holding some sort of office in the chapter in doing some work towards the operations. George spoke to me about offering to remain as Chapter Treasurer for Harry if that's what Harry would like to have happen. There are many open roles in this chapter and anyone interested in performing any little task can have a role in chapter leadership. It can be small or big. Maybe managing the team's website, or the newsletter, or simply making sure that get well cards go out sick members. The role of chapter MEC is also available. This simply entails a monthly review of the spreadsheet that is sent to that role, and contacting new, prospective, or expiring members. From your Chapter Educator:

Greetings Road Runners,

While teaching a class last week I had a reminder as to why you should practice your emergency skills to keep them at the top of your game. I was demonstrating the quick stop procedure for the skill test to the class. I completed the center stop with no problems. No so for the outside stop. As I came down I passed the stop cones, downshifted to first and applied my

brakes. Only problem was there being a rock the size of a BB on the traction patch when I applied the brakes. You guessed it, the front tire locked up and started to skid. I immediately realized what was going on and released the front brake. Bike straightened back up and I reapplied the front brake. The other instructor was quick to point out to the class that is what you do when you lock up your front tire. Going back and looking at the payment, I discovered a scrape about 4 feet long with the rock at the end of it. I wish I had been filming the demonstration as it was letter perfect and would have made a great teaching aid. That's why you need to practice so you are ready for whatever may happen.

Do You Even Counter steer?

In case you didn't know, over half of all rider fatalities are single-vehicle incidents that occur in corners. These riders were unable to get their motorcycle turned quickly enough or failed to lean their bike far enough to stay in their lane. This is usually because the rider lacked the critical skill of counter steering.

To get a motorcycle to turn you must lean it into the curve. But, how do you actually lean a motorcycle? The answer is counter steering. By pressing forward (and to a lesser degree, down) on the handlebar on the side that you want to turn, you essentially unbalance the bike so that it "falls" into a lean. Press on the right handlebar to initiate a lean to the right and press on the left handlebar to turn left.

It's common for people to think that moving their body weight makes the bike lean. Sure, shifting your body to one side or the other can get the machine to drift in that direction. But, you're not going to get the bike to turn quickly enough when riding at speed. The only efficient and effective way to get a motorcycle from upright to leaned is to counter steer with the handlebars.

Knowing how to get your motorcycle from upright-to-leaned quickly and effectively allows you to avoid cornering mishaps, but it also paves the path to becoming a cornering master. Without it you will struggle forever to corner with any real confidence.

Any questions? If you do I will be setting up some parking lot practices for us to practice our skills. Till next month, Ride safe.

Tire Pressure

More temperature sensitive than you might think

As the ambient temperature starts to cool down and we head into colder months of the year I thought it would be appropriate to discuss tire pressures and the effect of temperature on same. During the Chapter's Fall Ride to Mena, AR we experienced some temperature variances as well.

Stamped on the outside of many of your tires is a recommended tire pressure range. (At least an upper limit.) Your motorcycle owner's

manual will also list recommend tire pressure. The tire manufacture and owner's manual may vary. Typically keeping the tire pressure at the tire manufacture's higher limits will produce the best ride and longest tire life. Further, this pressure should be determined while the tires are cold - meaning, have not been used for a couple of hours.

Time and outside temperature effect the pressure within your tires. It is NORMAL for a tire to lose about 1 pound per square inch (psi) per month. Outside temperatures affect your tire pressure far more profoundly, however. A tire's pressure can change by 1 psi for every 10 degrees Fahrenheit of temperature change. As temperature goes, so goes pressure.

For example, if a tire is found to have 38 psi on an 80-degree mid-summer day, it could lose enough air to have an inflation pressure of 26 psi on a 20-degree day six months later. This represents a loss of 6 psi over six months and an additional loss of 6 psi due to the 60-degree temperature reduction.

At 26 psi, your tire is severely under inflated and dangerous!

There is nothing wrong with your tire if it behaves like this, of course. What is being illustrated here is that you MUST check your tire pressure on a regular basis and to be particularly aware of it on cold days.

So get out your GWRRA T-CLOCS Form and check your motorcycle before you ride, no matter the distance.

Hope you get out and enjoy the great fall weather. Ride safe
