There is no new published news from Region or National as of the writing of this newsletter. All for this month. Ride Safe.

From the Chapter Educator,

Weather is cooling off in Texas and we have had some nice days for riding. Thanks to Tommie and Judy for volunteering to lead a few of the rides. Next Texas Look Learn, Live Organization is looking for input for their next meeting. It deals with mapping out motorcycle rides. Here is what they are asking for: In advance of the November 16th TMSC meeting, we are asking that you review the new motorcycle mapping routes section on the www.looklearnlive.org website. You'll know you've found the right section when you see the "new" designation sign. Specifically, we're asking that you (1) watch at least one of the rider videos (There are three routes with videos: FM 149 through Sam Houston National Forest, FM 306 through Canyon Lake, and The Three Sisters), and (2) think of additional routes you would like to see mapped on the website. For the videos, we would like to know what safety information you would like included in the rider videos. Is it the same information that's already in the videos? What safety information should be added? What safety information should be eliminated? We want to ensure that the videos remain relevant and useful to riders. You can send the information to me or if you would like to attend the meeting go to the website and sign up to become a member and they will give you the information for time and date. Next is another tip from the Looklearnlive.org. Contrary to popular belief, most motorcycle fatalities do not occur in a collision with another vehicle at an intersection. A higher percentage involves motorcycles running off the roadway in a curve then striking a fixed object. If you are uncomfortable during road speed turns, increase your skill through training and practice. Classes on cornering are available in Texas and the practice is fun. If you find yourself coasting through corners with the power off, you have entered the turn too fast for your comfort level. Enter the next turn slower and add throttle as gently and early as possible through the turn. Your vision is the key to your survival in cornering. If you are approaching a blind curve due to a sight restriction of any kind, slow down! You do not know what's lurking just around the bend. The proper use of your vision through a turn is a skill! Turn your head before the corner starts and look far through the turn, keeping your head and eyes up. This will help you relax on the controls and see any issues far in advance. This is what I preach at my BRC classes. All for now. Safe Riding
