



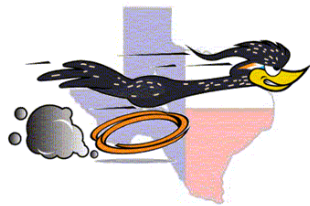

Rider Education Corner

DON'T PASS THIS UP

Can you really believe there's a supply chain crisis? Maybe when you look on the store shelves or are waiting for an order from Amazon you placed months ago, but it's hard to believe when you see the thousands of eighteen-wheelers rolling down the roads. They are unavoidable – especially on our main highways and interstates. We're even seeing more and more of them on our County Roads and Farm to Market Roads. Although they seem to be moving right along, sometimes we get behind them and don't like them blocking our view of what lies ahead.

Reminders for passing eighteen-wheelers and other large vehicles:

1. Ride in the left portion of the lane at a safe following distance to increase your line of sight and make you more visible. Signal and check for oncoming traffic. Use your mirrors and turn your head to check that it is clear from traffic behind.
2. When safe, move into the left lane and accelerate. Select a lane position that does not crowd the truck and provides space to avoid hazards in your lane.
3. Ride through the blind spots as quickly as possible. Remember passes must be completed within posted speed limits and only where permitted.

NOTE: When riding in a group, adjust your speed so that no rider has to linger in a blind spot.

4. Signal again and complete mirror and head checks before returning to your original lane. Allow adequate room before returning to your original lane as there is another blind spot in front of the cab. Don't forget to cancel your signal when the pass is complete.

NOTE: When riding in a group, the lead rider should pull out and pass when it is safe. After passing the leader should return to the left position and continue riding at passing speed to open room for the next rider. Next, the second rider should move up to the left position in the lane and wait for a chance to safely pass. When passing, make sure you have a clear view of oncoming traffic. Just because the lead rider passed, that doesn't mean that conditions have not changed and it is still safe for other riders to pass. After passing the rider should return to the right position and open room for the next rider. The process continues in the same manner for each of the other riders in the group.

Some people suggest that the lead bike should move to the right side of the lane after passing. This is not a good idea, however, since it might encourage the second rider to pass and cut back in before there is enough of a space cushion in front of the passed vehicle. It is safer to wait until there is adequate room ahead of the passed vehicle to allow each rider to move into the same position held before the pass.

Reminders when large vehicles are passing you:

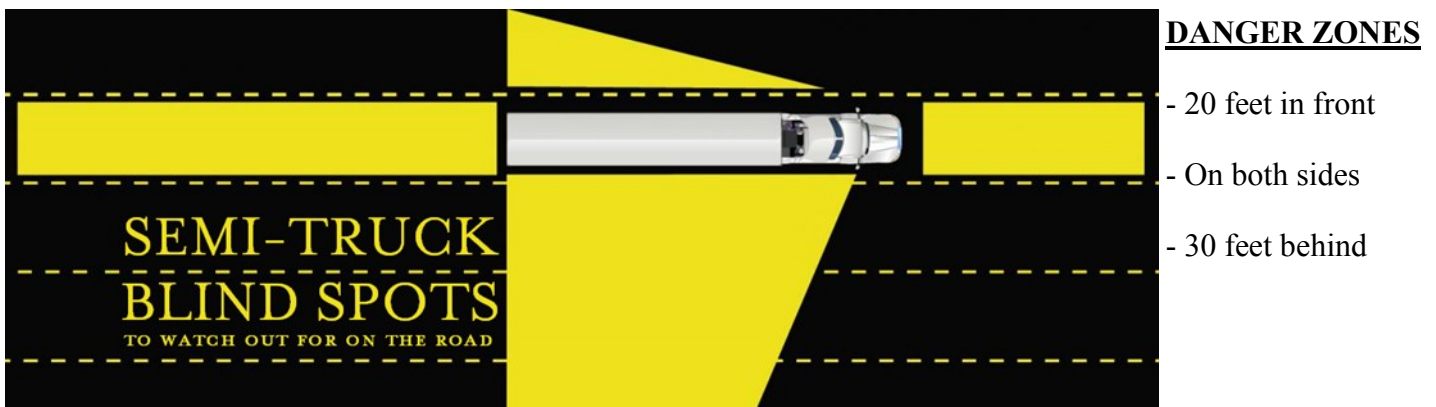
1. When you are being passed from behind stay as close to the center portion of your lane as possible. Riding to the passing truck could put you in a hazardous situation from:

- A slight mistake by you or the passing driver could cause a sideswipe.
- Extended mirrors; some drivers forget that their mirrors hang out farther than their fenders.
- Objects thrown from windows; even if the driver knows you're there, a passenger may not see you and might toss something on you or in the road ahead of you.
- Wind blasts; they can affect your control. You have more room for error if you are in the middle portion when hit by this blast than if you are on either side of the lane. Do not move into the portion of the lane farthest from the passing vehicle. It might invite the other driver to cut back into your lane too early.

NOTE: When riding in a group the tail gunner (drag) should alert the group when an eighteen-wheeler is approaching to pass. The group should keep a consistent speed; keep close ranks in a staggered formation allowing an adequate space cushion for each bike to react if needed.

Keeping these tips in mind will help you get home safely to those Amazon packages finally arriving on your front porch.

Options On Route Planning

Many ways are now available to help you plan your route. Some of us remember the old fashion way. Does Key Map ring a bell? It took a lot of page-turning to get from one point to the other, but it was very accurate.

Then came the mountable GPS, usually a Garmin, and their software. It wasn't the easiest to use, but it did work, and with some extra hardware you could tie it into your motorcycle

communications system, so you hear the turn instructions. Or be constantly reminded that you were off route.

Now we have Basecamp by Garmin. It helps create routes you can download to most any GPS, either factory installed or one mounted to your motorcycle.

Another option is Google Maps, which you can either print once you have your route planned, or have the route sent to your phone.

Still another choice is to press the Map App on your phone to set your location. You can also specify you do not want highways or toll roads. That way you can end up with a nice backroad route.

Regardless of your choice, a pre-ride is always a good idea if you have the time. Even the all-mighty Google doesn't know everything.


