Tips to make your motorcycle holidays better

Choose a destination and a route that suits you and your bike

If you are planning to motorcycle for the holidays make sure your bike is comfortable. You can always make some modifications to improve the comfort level of your ride, but you don't want to make any major changes at least 2 weeks before the ride. Choosing the right destination for you and your bike is key.

Choose the right clothing; don't overdress

What you choose to bring on your motorcycle road trip fairly depends on the location and climate you are planning to visit. You should always be prepared for any kind of weather. It's best to have the essential motorcycle clothing equipment. This will allow you to travel safely and be comfortable along the way.

The nature and length of your trip will help decide the diversity of your clothing. Wearing something two days in a row (other than your underwear, please!) can be the norm. Bringing one pair of jeans for repeat wear during evening outings is not a big deal – you're travelling by motorcycle and that's a great excuse, should someone notice. Roll your clothes, don't fold them. You can roll jeans and a shirt together and slide them into your saddlebag much easier than folded clothing, and this will help in reducing wrinkles if it matters.

Less is more

The more you bring, the more weight you'll add to your motorcycle. In this case: less is more. Make sure your tires are in good shape and that they can go the full distance. If you have any
