## Happy Thanksgiving!

**I**t is hard to believe that it is already November. I constantly look at the calendar and wonder where the rest of the year went. It's also hard to believe that EWMA completed its first year around two months ago. At every chapter meeting we attend we have been requesting feedback, and a chapter vote on whether that chapter wants to continue with EWMA or move to an independent status. Every chapter asked has confidently voted that the district and their chapter should remain in EWMA. I consider this a nearly unanimous decision, and so we will continue as an EWMA organization. The Texas District will cover all the charter fees for 2024 for all chapters. This works out to \$75 per chapter. For 2025 we will need to revisit this based on district funds, ride-in participation, success of fundraising events, and/or the solicitation of cooperative vendors. Donna and I have the intent of continuing as District Directors in 2024 unless someone else volunteers or EWMA chooses to replace us.

With this new affirmation of Texas being a part of the EWMA family, I feel comfortable in encouraging newly prospective members to join the organization, and for our current members to renew their memberships. I also encourage everyone to feel comfortable recruiting others to join us in this fraternity of riding enthusiasts! New members can join either through [ewma-world.org](http://ewma-world.org) website or by filling out the attached form I am asking George to include in the newsletter.

Over the past year I have given much thought over what value the EWMA organization offers its members. After all, this is a common question people ask me when I broached the subject. This is obviously not the old GWRRA nor does it offer all of the things we had become accustomed to over the years. The realization was that the old organization was not healthy. Yearly they bled membership mostly through attrition as the membership had aged and moved on to other things in life, or to the great mysteries beyond

this life. The new organization was built to try to change those trends and become a more open organization of other brands of motorcycles, and a world beyond the diminishing attendance of Gold Wing rallies. Texas has hosted two ride-ins that were broadly enjoyed. These events were less expensive to put on and more geared towards exploring the roads surrounding the whole city. The types of motorcycles that attended varied greatly. I have concluded that this holds the best hope for success for any motorcycle organization. Additionally, the cost of membership is extremely low. \$20 per year for a lone Rider, or \$30 for a couple. If you join, or renew for more than one year there are additional discounts that save you even more money. Donna and I attend at least two chapter meetings per month in the DFW area and sometimes more. Each time we spend more than that on dinner. The list of benefits of membership evolves month over month. See some highlights below.

- An electronic version of “the Eagle Book”. This is a continuation of the Gold Book offered by GWRRA which lists other members from across the world who can offer assistance, lodging or other services when you are traveling abroad. As a member you have the ability of offering these same services if you so choose and having your information in this eagle book too.
- Assorted discounts and offers from a variety of vendors resourced by the staff of EWMA, such as hotel discounts, rental cars, training opportunities and marketing materials through Vistaprint.
- As a member, each person you recruit to our organization can get you free months of membership for yourself and your family up to six months per year.
- Access to the national home page that includes forums in which the canonical advice, epic ride opportunities and other chapters worldwide which you can attend at any time.

- An open invitation to attend the events of all EWMA chapter and district rallies and ride-ins, as well as motorcycle centric cruises organized each year.

Perhaps the greatest offer of all has nothing to do with product nor services, but instead is the sense of belonging our members feel to one another and to the chapters and the district of Texas. The knowledge of knowing that you can show up at any other chapter event in the state of Texas or anywhere else and know that you will be in the presence of people who share the same passion for motorcycles and the same desire for camaraderie. These chapters and districts are led by volunteers who have committed time and money towards offering a safe venue for sharing ideas, knowledge and ride experiences. Whether a rider is new or well-seasoned, they will benefit from being part of a group where riding safely is the major focus.

To encourage folks to continue to join this new organization, Texas will be sponsoring a raffle. From

the very first member who joined back last year, to the newest of members, each new membership or renewal of a previous membership will receive entry into a raffle for at least \$500 to be drawn in March at the Yellow Rose Ride In in Kerrville, Texas. You will NOT need to be present to win. For couples memberships you will receive two raffle tickets. If you sign up for multiple years, you will receive a raffle ticket for each person, times the number of years you signed up for. Between now and then the Texas District team will be looking for sponsors to allow us to increase the prize money that will be given at that time!

We appreciate the support you all show to you Texas District and Chapters!

# Gremlin Bells

Gremlin Bells, also known as [Guardian Bells](#), Motorcycle Bells, or Spirit Bells, are a good luck charm attached to the bottom of motorcycles that are believed to protect riders while on the road.

## What Are Motorcycle Gremlins?

According to legend, many a mile of roads are littered with evil spirits or gremlins that lie in wait, waiting for unsuspecting bikers to pass by close enough for them to latch on to their motorcycle. These evil little creatures are thought to be the source of most bikers problems and bad luck, such mechanical issues, and at worst, can make a biker crash, such as if they were to chase animals into the road. As gremlins and evil road spirits are said to mostly lurk on the road waiting on their next victim, hanging a motorcycle bell below the bike will capture them as you ride over them, and the tinkling bell will drive them insane, forcing them to eventually leave or fall off.

## What Is the Story Behind the Gremlin Bell?

But how did this tradition start? It all starts with a story that originated many, many years ago in the high desert near the US-Mexico border

## The Legend of the Gremlin Bell

It was a bitter winter night in December. The cool desert air was crisp, the moon lighted the night sky, and the desert cactus cast eerie shadows. An old grey bearded biker was returning from a road trip to Mexico, his bike loaded with Christmas gifts he had purchased to give to children at an orphanage near where he lived. Shortly after crossing the border, he thought he saw something in the distance but couldn't be sure. He thought his mind may have been playing tricks on him, but as the biker rounded a corner and neared the location in the road, he crashed without warning and was thrown from his bike, slamming into the desert floor. Disoriented, the old biker looked up and in shock, realized what he had seen. There in front of him were a group of gremlins, rejoicing in

their success. The road gremlins began moving toward him as the biker lay on the ground, barely alive and unable to move from the impact. With nothing to defend himself, it seemed like the end of the road for the old biker. However, he noticed one of his saddlebags had broken loose in the crash and quickly reached out, pulling it close to him. Grabbing the gifts from the bag, he threw them at the nasty little group of approaching gremlins to scare them off. He threw present after present, but the gremlins did not stop. Reaching into the now nearly-empty bag, he was down to his last items – small bells he had purchased as gifts for the children. As a last resort, he rang them as quickly as he could, hoping the noise would scare the gremlins away.

## The Nearby Bikers

Now, it just so happened that two bikers coincidentally were camping nearby. Over the quiet night air, they heard a bell ringing in the distance. Of course, largely assuming they were alone in the vast desert, this was something unexpected for them to hear. The two bikers went to investigate the source of the ringing. Nearing the noise, they came across the old biker laying at the crash site, the road gremlins eagerly waiting to claim their reward. The bikers attacked the gremlins, fending them off and sending them fleeing into the night. The old biker wanted to repay them for saving his life and offered them payment for their help, but they refused. Determined to pay them back in some way, as a gesture of good will, the biker cut his saddlebag tassels and tied the very bells that saved his life to the two bikers bikes, telling them that if they should ever need help, ring their bells attached to their bike and it could just save their life.

Note: Can you buy your own Guardian Bell? As a rule of thumb, you shouldn't purchase your own bell, as it's said that the bell works only when gifted to you.
