Congratulations to us, all of us!

We have made it to 2023 And GWRRA is in the rearview mirror for most of us. I believe most of us were made whole when are membership dues were refunded, especially those of us whose checks did not bounce. If you are one of the few unfortunates that are still having issues please reach out to Donna and I, and we will see if we can find people from the old organization that may be able to help. P.S. We still have some financial work that will need to be done in the beginning of 2023, which includes our filing of our 990-Ns. We are still awaiting the final details of that from Randall Drake. More on that once we have the information available.

Chapter staff, keep an eye on your emails, as we are sending out the officer appointment forms for all Chapter Directors, and Chapter Treasures to fill out and return to us. We are also sending out Chapter Application forms to a couple folks who are wishing to bring their chapter into EWMA. As stated before, Texas district will cover the charter fees for any chapter joining EWMA for at very least the 2023 calendar year. It is one of the goals of the district to raise enough money at our District Rally and any Ride-Ins to cover the charter fees at the end of the year for 2024. We in the district would really like to remove financial hardships from chapter life so that we can focus in on riding.

The new district website (ewma-tx.org) has gotten a refresh thanks to Tom Sprague, and new information is being posted on a regular basis. All EWMA forms will start being available on this website, until the national website is up running and functional. One of the services the district will do for all of our chapters is to offer a place for the chapter

websites to exist. As of right now we are encouraging chapters to create a graphically interesting PDF that would mimic a web page including chapter staff information, regular logistic information like chapter gathering locations, and where you regularly gather at the beginning of a ride. This PDF will be linked to your chapter information to make it easy to get new members to locate you and your crew. It is obviously still acceptable for you to have your own website and domain registration, but by using district resources you avoid the costs that your chapter membership has to pay. These PDFs can be refreshed as often as you wish to keep the information from getting stale. We encourage everyone to visit (ewma-tx.org) and review the information for accuracy.

The Texas District Rally will be happening in Kerrville TX, at the Y.O. Ranch just like last year. This will be happening from April 27th through the 29th, and we have a special rate at the Y.O. Ranch of \$119 a night. This is obviously more expensive than last year, but inflation is hitting everyone hard. I do not look forward to seeing the cost of their egg breakfast! Details about the rally will be discussed on January 28th, by the Texas district staff, and we will have a better idea of cost, training schedules, and other rally related activities. This will be our first rally since the dissolution of GWRRA, and we looked to have this rally be open to any and all comers, inexpensive, and full of activities that take advantage of the Kerrville area. All proceeds from this rally will support district commitments to Texas district chapters, and the training of all motorcyclists for the common goal of safer roads.

Now that the new organization has been established, the larger and more complicated goal of growth and providing increased value for our

membership begins. Region and national staff are encouraging all chapters and members to focus on attracting motorcycle riders who will enjoy our groups who actively promote local rides, as well as throughout Texas and beyond. It is not that the new organization does not value former riders, or the experience that they bring to our meetings, it is simply the fact that a new rider, joins a motorcycle organization to find people to ride with. The dining with friends is a side benefit. As is the case in any organization, if you want the organization to thrive, you need to constantly augment membership with that of the next generation. GWRA had in many ways failed in keeping relevant with new riders. Our reputation of being old men and women driving to DQ had been cemented in the minds of so many potential members. It was truly a shame that we were not able to attract more youth to our groups. Having a more diverse age group at our gatherings would have made all of us feel younger. And we believe this is the recipe for success in any new organization.

Many of us who experienced firsthand the closure of GWRRA at Wing Ding last year, were to a degree, a bit excited about the possibilities. Out of the dust and excitement, three organizations were created, each with a slightly different focus, but ultimately with the end goal of offering motorcycle enthusiasts opportunities similar to what was offered in the old organization. Many of us chose to join the two membership based organizations, EWMA, and Wing'd Riders. I for one have enjoyed the monthly magazine coming out of the Wing'd Riders organization, and look forward to many more. The EWMA organization however has given me the familiar home feel chapter life with plenty of opportunities for riding and socializing. The third organization it's not as well-known, but offers an important service that all motorcycle organizations are now free to use. Built upon the GWRRA

education programs, including the levels program, RPM, LLC will, for the foreseeable future be our partner for offering our chapters and members training opportunities to keep their skills focused and sharp. The levels program is not gone, and passed achievements have been carried over to the new organization. Texas district is completely committed to offering training and safety instruction to everyone to make sure everyone gets home safely after each ride. Ultimately the gist of these three organizations, in my view, is that the three should continue to work together for the benefit of all the members. There is no reason to put up defensive walls or restrictions that would get in the way of our friendships. As of right now, the three organizations are not in conflict with one another, offering complementary services, which after adding up all membership fees, still remain less expensive than the old organization. I feel that the disciplines that each bring to the table will get us far greater attention to detail, and will in the end make the experience better not worse.

This is a very exciting time! I wish you all the greatest of New Years and ask you to join with your fellow members, friends, riding partners to make everything that we do a success. When things get tough in life it is friendship, and extended family that help us pull through. For most of us, an extended ride on the motorcycle helps us get our thoughts straight, and puts us in a mood more worthy of this gift of life we have all been given.

God bless you all, and may our guardian angels ride with us every time we hit the road.

RPM Training Academy Announcement

I know that many of you are wondering when On-Bike, Classroom, and MFA/CPR training will be offered again. Although GWRRRA shut down all operations and programs, the training programs including all riding courses, most of the classroom modules, MFA/First Aid classes, and the return of the Levels program have been acquired by a new provider: RPM Training Academy.

I just received an announcement this week from Lorrie Thomas, former GW University Director and Susan Huttman, former GW Rider Education Director announcing that RPM is almost ready to open. They have their website <https://rpmacademy.net/> being developed and the initial framework is online now. If you spent any time on the University website, you'll see many similarities and forms already posted. There are links to coming classes, how-to's and more.

RPM is currently contacting former instructors to secure their commitment, but new instructors are welcome and the training will be similar to the ITCP training GW offered. By my count, we currently have 14 certified Academy instructors spread over different chapters in Texas.

There are still some unanswered questions regarding protocols and structure of the training. I will update you as we find out more regarding this rollout, but I hope you will share my excitement that we are continuing our commitment of Safety and Knowledge for all riders in Texas.

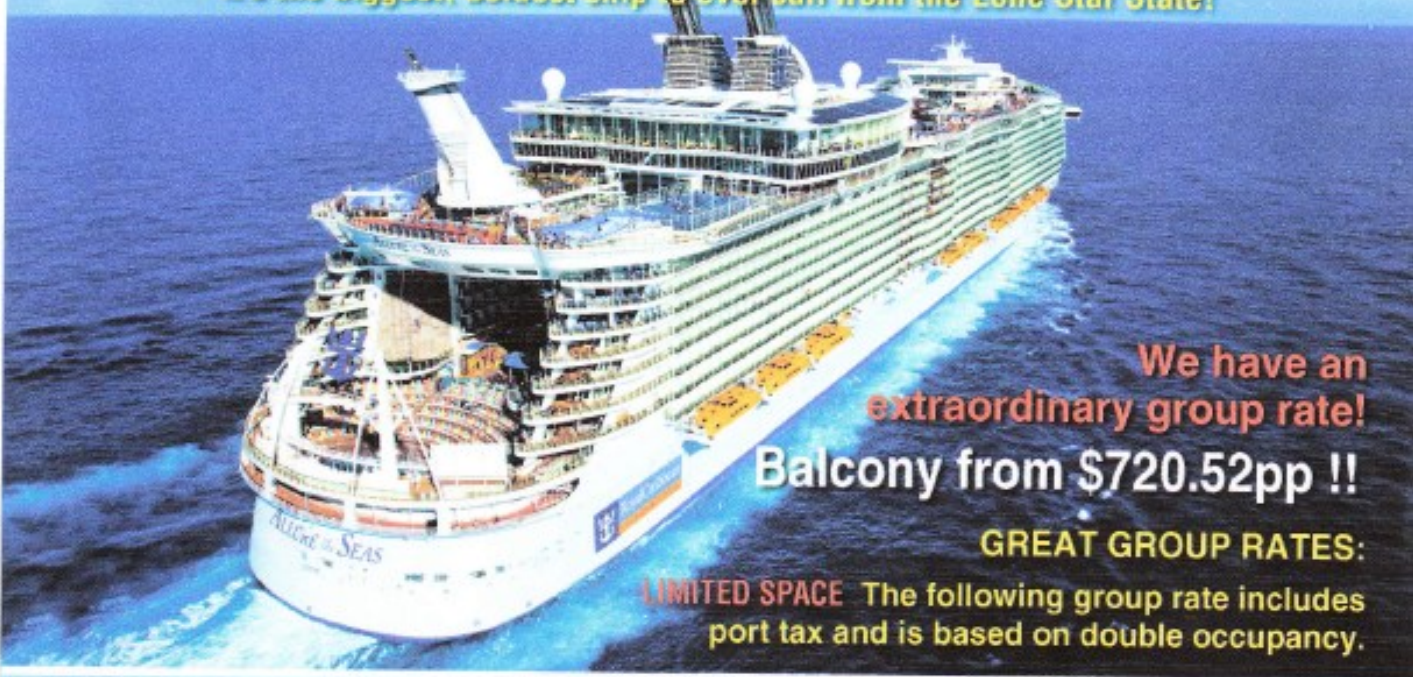

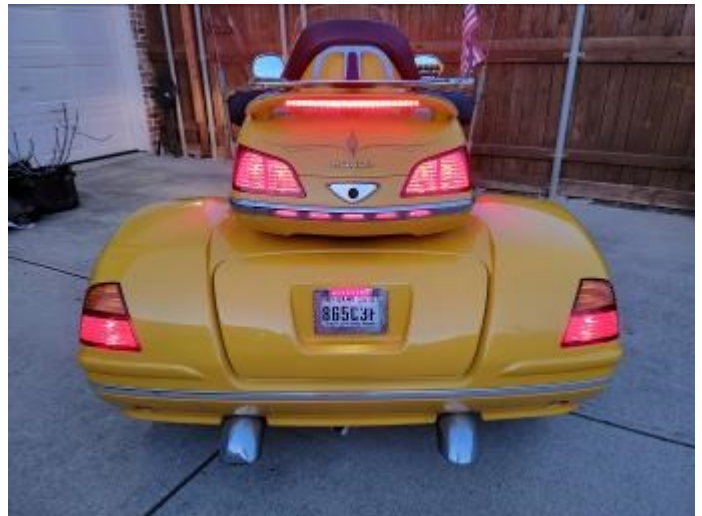
