



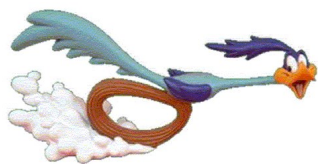

# Rider Education Corner

## Scott Polhemus

**W**OW! Spring is almost here. Along with all the rains and ‘road hazards’ that winter has created for us. I ran across this story while I was looking around the web. I thought the timing was rather perfect.

Cattle Country - By Tom Jenkins, Texas

While taking a long weekend trip with a fellow rider in South Texas, I was abruptly brought to a conclusion that anything can happen when you are riding a motorcycle. We were riding in perfect weather, maybe a little warm, in what we call ranch country. I’ve always been keenly aware of livestock which seem to escape their fences or the occasional deer that darts into your lane at the most inopportune time. However, I was caught completely by surprise by what appeared in the road on this day.

Since I had been riding for more than 20 years on various sized motorcycles, I felt capable of handling almost anything. But today was to be a new lesson. As we were riding along at about 60 mph and I was in the lead when I noticed a discoloration on the pavement ahead. My first thought was that sand had washed over the road and that I immediately should slow down to a safe speed to negotiate it. I kept slowing as I approached the “discoloration” until I was only riding at about 30 mph when I reached it. But of course, it was then that I realized that what I had seen wasn’t sand or gravel on the pavement. It was much worse. My friend and I found ourselves trying to keep our rides “shiny side up” on what seemed to be greased

ball bearings. After we negotiated the impediment and regained our composure, we stopped to examine the road only to discover that some rancher had lost a load of cow pellets. For those who aren’t familiar with this product, it consists of very hard, compressed mixtures of feed and grass to form a cylinder about 1/2 inch in diameter and about 2 inches in length. In essence, we were riding over a patch of “roller bearings.”

To this day, I don’t see how either of us was able to negotiate the hazard without mishap. I can only attribute our success to slowing to a speed with enabled forward progress without losing control

In all my riding, I have been lucky that I wasn’t the first one to ride up on something similar. But I have seen many bags of ‘hazards’ that have fallen on the road, but by the time I saw them they were mostly off to the edge of the road. Seems that most of the usual hazards we encounter in North Texas are gravel and rocks that have ended up on the road from someone’s driveway or a dirt road.

Now we are in the season where RAIN is more likely to be the biggest hazard that we will encounter. Of course, we all have our Frog Toggs rain gear in our saddlebags, right? But if you are like me, ya HATE to pull them out until it already raining. They are just too hot to wear until you absolutely have to. Has everyone reapplied RAIN-X to their windscreen and visor? It only takes a few minutes and helps considerably. It’s also a good time to reapply whatever anti-fog

stuff you happen to use inside your visor. Would be a royal pain if all the rain was rolling off your windscreen and visor, and the humidity were to blind you with fog in your helmet!

Of course, we all know that when the weather begins to get ugly, we should slow down and look closer to see from what direction the weather is heading. As well as just how ‘ugly’ it is looking.

It’s never a bad idea to pull into a gas station and grab a bit of gas or a drink to wait a few minutes after sprinkles begin. The first 15 minutes after things turn wet are the most dangerous, as all the oil and road grime floats to the surface and begins to be washed away by car and truck tires. That will also give you a chance to look and determine if this is just a quick 30-minute shower, or something bigger that would force you to pull out all the rain gear.

And we should never forget tires. Do they have plenty of tread depth to help avoid hydroplaning? What about tire pressures? Did you check them when you got on the motorcycle? Even a few pounds low will reduce the amount of traction your tires have available, and in the rain, we need every little bit we can get.

Just remember, Have fun out there! And anything that helps you arrive safe is good, even if it makes you look funny or aggravates the cars around you.

## CHAPTER SKILL ENHANCEMENT ADVISOR

### Job Summary

The role of Chapter Skill Enhancement Advisor (CSEA) is to proactively support Member/Participant by providing them with information they can consider on ways to become skilled, prepared and safer riders and co-riders.

#### Encouraged Responsibilities

- Serve as an example by being actively engaged in the Levels Program.
- Monthly, or as often as possible and weather permitting based on Members interest, put on an on-bike skills day with skill practice, bike games for riders and co-riders.
- Team with the Chapter Ride Coordinator to promote the importance of best riding practices at chapter gatherings, rides and events.
- Utilize the quarterly Chapter Levels Report provided by the District Educator to support the Members and assist them in achieving milestones and earning recognition.
- Communicate directly with the District Educator to advocate for classes and courses to serve any chapter participant with an interest in progressing in the levels program, becoming a more proficient rider and being better prepared to respond to emergency situations.

### Qualifications and Skills

The Chapter Skill Enhancement Advisor:

- is not an officer; and the position is not mandatory.
- has a basic knowledge of the GWRRA Rider Education Program
- is appointed by the Chapter Director
- is interviewed by the District Educator
- completes a Confidentiality Agreement
- is a current Level II Rider or Co-Rider
- receives guidance and support from the District Educator
- communicates with the District Educator directly, keeping the Chapter Director in the loop to assure the needs of the chapter participants are met. Remember, the Chapter Skill Enhancement Adviser is an active participant on the Chapter staff and primary direction comes from the Chapter Director
- does not have access to the RE database and relies on the District Educator for the information.

**Goal:** To provide the membership with the basic support needed to participate meaningfully and successfully in the GWRRA Rider Education Program at the Chapter level.
